
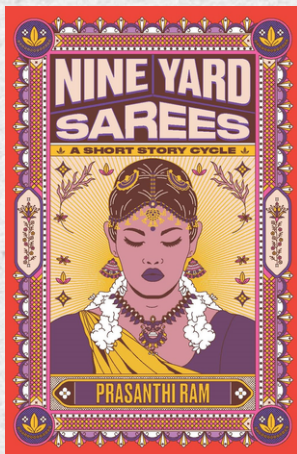


CURATED LIST OF LOCAL LITERATURE *in Singapore*

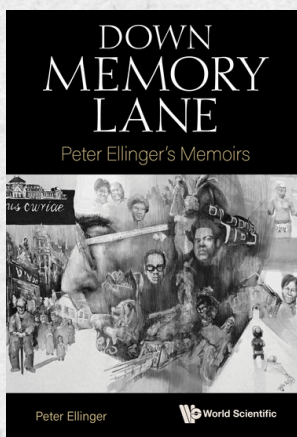
1 - Nine Yard Sarees: A Short Story Cycle, by Prasanthi Ram Published by Ethos Books

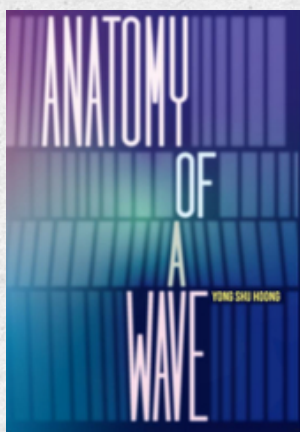
4: Pulp III: An Intimate Inventory of the Banished Book, by Shubigi Rao Published by Rock Paper Fire Singapore

5: Anatomy Of A Wave, by Yong Shu Hoong Published by Dakota Books

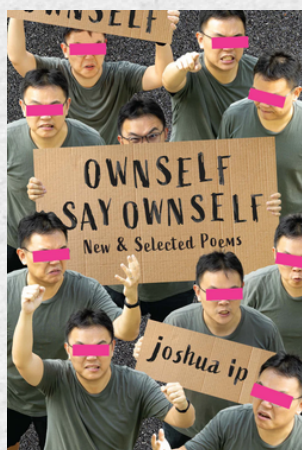


A book comprising a collection of poems deriving figurative language from the audiovisual representations of waves.

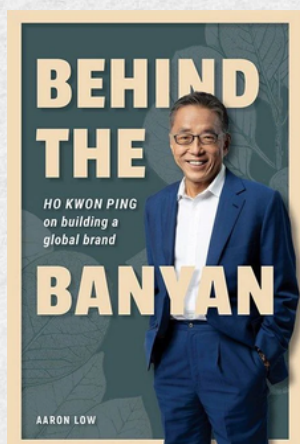
A collection of essays by the author on what he valued and felt was essential to highlight about Singapore, its people and the world around him.

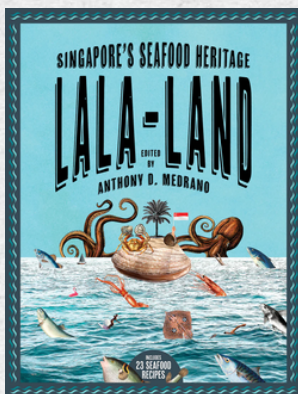
9: BMT Sketchbook, by Asher Ong
