TOP 5 FOODS

to try



Laksa

A spicy noodle soup dish, featuring a rich, coconut-based fragrant broth, served with rice noodles and various toppings such as prawns, egg and tofu puffs.

Chilli Crab

Mud crabs stir-fried in a semi-thick, sweet, savoury, and spicy tomato and-chili-based sauce, often served with fluffy mantou buns for dipping.

Chicken Rice


Poached or steamed chicken served with rice that's been cooked with chicken stock, sesame oil, ginger and garlic.

Kaya Toast

Toasted bread spread with kaya (a coconut jam) and butter, often served with soft-boiled eggs and coffee. A staple for Singaporeans for breakfast.

Durian

Not for the faint-hearted - a tropical fruit distinguished by its large size and spiky, hard outer shell. It has a pungent smell, custard-like flesh with large seeds.





Sentosa
